

BETTER BUSINESS BUREAU 2016 STUDENT OF INTEGRITY SCHOLARSHIPS

DESCRIPTION

Better Business Bureau of Minnesota and North Dakota (BBB) promotes integrity and ethics in the marketplace through voluntary business self-regulation. Each year we present the BBB Torch Awards for Ethics to companies who demonstrate ethical business practices. BBB also recognizes that ethics and integrity are founded on principles we learn young...at home, at school, and in dealings with our peers. For that reason, we are proud to offer an annual scholarship program recognizing Students of Integrity. Recipients are selected primarily upon the basis of a written essay or video entry.

These scholarships are designed to recognize and promote ethics and integrity among young people. BBB will award scholarships to graduating high school senior students who personify all of the best aspects of high character in their personal choices and actions. Scholarship money is awarded directly toward winners' post-secondary education expenses (tuition or room/board only) at any accredited institution. This is a one-time, non-renewable scholarship. The recipient is required to be enrolled in an educational institution beginning the first fall quarter/trimester/semester immediately following high school graduation and may designate when during the school year they would like the scholarship applied.

AWARD GUIDELINES

Entries for the Student of Integrity Scholarship will be reviewed by an independent panel of judges selected by BBB who will be local business and community leaders, educators and the media. Judging will be based mainly on the content of the essay or video, although academic transcripts, one reference letter and outside activities may also be used by the judges in making their final selections.

Applications will be accepted only from Minnesota and North Dakota students from accredited high schools who will be seniors in the 2016-2017 school year. The scholarship is not open to BBB employees, interns, or BBB Board of Directors and their family members.

PROCEDURE & DEADLINE

All entries must be received no later than **Thursday.** September 22, 2016 at 4:30 p.m. Entries received after 4:30 p.m. on September 22, 2016 will not be accepted. No faxed or e-mailed information will be accepted. Please make sure your name is on every page

submitted and all required paperwork is received at the same time. Entries will not be returned; please retain a copy for your records.

BBB Student of Integrity Scholarship AWARD CRITERIA AND DOCUMENTATION

Check boxes to verify completion and accuracy of all documentation of entry

 Essay or Video Students have the option of writing an essay or creating a video. Scholarships will be awarded in both categories. 	
Please read and consider the 20 principles found on the document entitled UncommonSense. In our mission to promote high standards of business ethics and conduct in the marketplace, your Better Business Bureau continues to implement all of the principles and characteristics described in UncommonSense as a guide, model and first language for our BBB.	
Select one or more of the UncommonSense principles and write an essay or create a video that gives a specific, personal example of how you were challenged or struggled through a difficult situation and how you overcame the situation by the application of high character and personate ethics. Include your own application of the principle(s) and demonstrate how they guided your behavior or decisions.	
The essay must be 1,000 words or less, typed and double-spaced document.	
The video must be between 30 seconds to 3 minutes long. Any kind of video style is allowed. Record your video on your cell phone, video camera, flip camera or any other medium you like. A brief (50 words or less) introductory paragraph may be submitted as well.

3. One letter of recommendation (one page only) From school official, community leader, employer, or community leader that addresses the applicant's character and actions	
4. A copy of your high school transcript	
5. A list of your extracurricular activities in high school	
6. A short paragraph describing your post-secondary plans and goals.	
7. Mail or deliver all documents in a 9" x 12" envelope to the address below Do not staple or paperclip your pages together or use plastic page covers
